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## Intercultural Training Programme

eCUTE is a research project funded by the European Union. eCUTE aims to create and encourage technology enhanced learning experiences to promote cultural awareness. In 21st century Europe, many cultural, ethnic and religious groups must live and work together. This is not always a smooth process and cultural differences can lead to social stresses and conflict. eCUTE has developed the Traveller prototype as an intercultural training application for young adults. You will have the opportunity to interact with Traveller as part of this Intercultural Training experience.

### During the Intercultural Training programme you will:

1. Complete several questionnaires
2. Interact with the intercultural training application, Traveller, using Microsoft Kinect with gesture recognition interaction
3. Have the opportunity to access cutting edge research via videos, documents, downloads and software
4. Critique and review Traveller
5. Participate in a short discussion about your Traveller experience.

### Schedule of activity, completed over 3 weeks:

- **Phase one:**
  - Questionnaire completion, and time-slot availability to use the Traveller application (approx 30 minutes)
  - Complete an online questionnaire in your own time (refer to instructions on the next page).
- **Phase two:**
  - Participate in the Traveller Intercultural Training session:
    - Interact with Traveller
    - Completion of evaluation instruments
    - Participation in a short discussion group (approx. 30 minutes)
  - Completion of Traveller feedback critique, for submission by the end of the week.
- **Phase three:**
  - Questionnaire completion
  - Informed session about Intercultural Understanding and Training via on-line resources
  - Receive Certificate

Completion of this programme will result in a **certificate in Intercultural Training**, that will be a useful addition to your CV, or for anyone interested in gaining the SUPA award.

## IAT - Instructions

The IAT (Implicit Association Test) is designed to detect the strength of a person's association between representations of objects. The IAT requires you to sort words and pictures into categories as **quickly** as possible, while making as few mistakes as possible. You should be able to this task in **less than 10 minutes**.

### Keep in mind:

- Read all instructions.
- Keep your index fingers on the 'e' and 'i' keys to enable rapid response
- Two labels at the top of the screen will tell you which words or images go with each key.
- Please try give your responses as **quickly** as possible
- Expect to make a few mistakes because of going fast. That's OK!
- For best results, make sure that your monitor is set to maximum brightness and avoid distractions.

### To begin the IAT:

1. Go to: <http://ecute.eu/traveller/iat/>
2. Enter your University User ID in the box at the top
3. Press submit
4. Read all instructions before beginning the test
